The steady growth of the Albrecht Dürer Airport Nuremberg

Nuremberg's economic importance is boosted by its excellent traffic links and central location. The main train station, recently refurbished to a very high standard, is linked to major European ICE, EC and IC train routes, and is used by about 45 million travellers each year. Nuremberg Harbour on the Main-Donau-Kanal has Southern Germany's largest cargo centre, and it is the central cargo hub between the North Sea harbour of Rotterdam and the South-East European harbours on the Danube, right to the Black Sea.

According to a German-wide survey (Qualitätsmonitor) of leisure travelers and business travelers, airlines provide the second most important mode of transport for people to visit Nuremberg - right behind the automobile. With about 3.5 million passengers and 50 non-stop air connections to more than 300 destinations, the Albrecht Dürer Airport Nuremberg counts as one of Germany's Top 10 international airports today.

In 2017, more non-stop flights than ever before will be included: 16 additional flight destinations and in total 62 non-stop air connections will become implemented. These include popular vacation areas and fascinating cities. The new flight plan for summer will apply from March, 26 and includes Madrid, Palermo, Verona, Porto, Bari (Ryanair), Paphos, Adana, Reykjavik/Keflavik, Athens (Germania), Birmingham (bmi regional), Belgrade, Tuzla and Kiev. Furthermore, Ryanair successfully started air connections to Rome, Milan, Budapest, Malta and Manchester in winter 2016 and will continue to approach these airports.

The flight plan in winter includes 3 new destinations. Ryanair will fly non-stop from Nuremberg to Krakow and Vilnius, the airline Germania will add a new air connection from Nuremberg to Tel Aviv.
